Dear Faculty of Health Colleagues and Friends:

Season's Greetings. We have just received news that the Syrian refugee we have sponsored will arrive on December 19th! With the arrival date fast approaching, we are asking for your help in ensuring that they are welcomed warmly to their life in Toronto. For more information on the individual we have pledged to help, see the next page.

We are deeply grateful for the support we have received so far, which has already helped us raise just over \$23,000. We know that we can do even more by continuing to mobilize the talents and resources of the Faculty of Health community- we hope that you will join or add to our efforts! As you know, our Faculty is deeply committed to values such as social justice, equity, and diversity. This is an opportunity for us to put our values into concrete action.

Here is how you can join me in helping:

- Help us reach our fundraising goal of \$27, 000 by December 31st! If you donate before December 31, 2016 you will receive an instant charitable tax receipt! - In order to ensure that the newcomer is involved in choosing their new home, it is recommended that initially they stay in a temporary (up to one month) home, while we help them find a more permanent option. If you have a room in your house, or an apartment vacancy, sublet or other opportunity to host, please let the team know by indicating it in the survey below or contacting apetro@yorku.ca. Rent will be provided.

Who are we sponsoring?

The individual we are sponsoring is in their early twenties and the youngest in their family. In 2011 when the political tension started in Syria, the family was separated and the individual we are sponsoring was the only one left in Syria. As the situation progressed further, many Syrians fled from their towns and were displaced to neighboring countries such as Turkey, Saudi Arabia, Jordan, Egypt, Lebanon and other European countries. Eventually, the individual we are sponsoring was also forced to leave his town and country, without even packing.

Our team has had the opportunity to connect with this individual, and we are very much looking forward to welcoming him to Canada. He is a hardworking person eager to make a positive impression in his new country. He has plans to continue his education in business. However, he recognizes the need to start by strengthening his English language skills. His biggest hope is that, after waiting for five years, he will have the opportunity to be reunited in Canada with his family.
